## Re: Letter of Support: Spalding University Teacher Leader Masters Program

This letter is written to serve as documentation of our collaboration and input with the planning and design of the Teacher Leader Master's Program at Spalding University. Our district was invited to participate in the development of the program beginning in 2008. In March of 2009, representatives of the superintendent of Jefferson County Public Schools department of leadership development met with Spalding administration and faculty to discuss efforts on the redesign of both the Principal Preparation Program and the Teacher Leader Masters Program. Due to our discussion and our past partnership in co-teaching courses in school instructional leadership program, the collaboration on the development of the Teacher Leader master's program with a co-teaching and co-designing format was a natural development. The program submission also includes enhanced field-based activities.

- Facilitate coaching and leadership opportunities for the candidate.
- Support collaborative team building projects.
- Support the public presentations of the action research projects.
- Co-design, co-plan and co-deliver courses.

As the district superintendent's designee for leadership development, we strongly support the Teacher Leader Masters of Arts in Education degree program. We believe that teacher leaders should continually reflect and refine their leadership skills to provide maximum effectiveness in their leadership for student learning, implement and evaluate promising practice through research, support fellow teacher growth and serve as instructional leaders with their colleagues.

We believe professional learning community cultures within our district and we appreciate the collaborative approach to the design of the Principal Preparation and Teacher Leader Programs. This signature serves as documentation of the collaboration between Jefferson County Public Schools department of leadership development and Spalding University.
